LOGLINE

Loneliness hides behind closed doors and around every corner. But can you fight it without facing your own fear of death?

SYNOPSIS

When Rotterdam citizen Bep de Bruin is found dead in her home, lying there unnoticed for 10 years, the city is in shock. How could this happen? Ada (59) and her best friend Wilma (70) decide to volunteer for the local government's response: a campaign against loneliness. Together, they go door to door to check in on elderly citizens, looking for lonely people that fit the profile and need help. This is how they meet Jan, who has barely left his home in seven years. In fighting to stay independent, his loneliness intensifies, and Ada and Wilma are upset by his insufficient quality of care. They also encounter Tilly, a strong and stubborn woman who has contact with no one but her beloved dog, and refuses every offer of support. Overwhelmed by the loneliness they encounter, and by their fear for what this means for them and their city, Ada and Wilma stop observing — and take action.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

In 2013 the body of the 74-year-old Bep de Bruin was found. She had been lying dead in her home in Rotterdam for 10 years without being noticed. The city was in shock. How could this have happened? How could it be that no one had missed her?

At the time, I closely followed the reports about Bep de Bruin and the discussion about loneliness that followed after that. I was touched by the reactions of the local residents. I found it unbelievable to hear that for a large part of the Dutch people (and the same is true in other European countries), their social contacts are not satisfactory. That many people indicate that they feel lonely. How is that possible? Do we live differently together than before? Are we really not paying attention anymore? Is loneliness the ultimate consequence of the fact that we can no longer live together?

When the city of Rotterdam started a campaign against loneliness among the elderly, it gave me a starting point for making this film. During my research with a questionnaire under my arm, I made home visits to people over 75, just like the two volunteers Ada and Wilma in my film. I heard countless life stories from the elderly

and once again realized how unruly and complicated it might be to live together, but also how beautiful and moving it can be. And it made me think: what kind of neighbour am I myself? And how am I going to arrange things myself when I am old? Who do I want to be able to fall back on?


