I'm moving onto the next state of existence which could be nothing. Could be something. Hell yeah I have regrets. Anybody that says "oh, I don't - I live life with no regrets" is full of shit.

For him to come off of the oxygen he would need to be sedated ahead of time because the symptoms of respiratory failure are certain to be severe and distressing. And that's where we would use sedatives and put him into a place of unconsciousness and his oxygen would be removed and his life would end very soon after that. It's legal it's ethical and it's his right. A natural death for Ethan would have been two decades ago.

And I think about it too I said, Well would it be - would it have been harder if I saw you know Ethan had been killed in like a car wreck or something like that. I don't know.
