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SYNOPSIS

At 34, Igor Levit is one of the world's greatest living classical pianists. Over the course of 2 years, Igor Levit: No Fear presents an intimate portrait of his all-consuming passion with the piano, his collaborations with conductors, orchestras and recording artists, and the embrace of his audiences. When Covid hit, Levit adapted and began an online home concert series that inspired and became a sensation. Igor Levit: No Fear reveals his philosophies, passion and commitment to his art.

DIRECTORS' STATEMENT

As a child I loved playing the piano, but hated practicing and lessons. So it became a very short episode in my life. But I remember well what happened to the melodies I played. They turned into stories. There were dangers, adventures, and there were last-minute rescues. I think I understand Igor Levit when he says that with music he tells stories, stories about people. I, too, am a storyteller. What always interests me in my films is the question: where does art come from? From biography? Is it a "divine gift"? How does this apply to Igor Levit? Having come to Germany from Russia with his Jewish family at the age of 8, he has effectively forgotten the first years of his childhood. But his hands remember that he received piano lessons at the age of three. What is the key to the incredible emotional and artistic intensity of his musical interpretation? How does Levit transform music into a state of mind? How does it feel to live with such a great talent that makes so many people happy? but can perhaps become an obligation, a burden, for the gifted themselves? Does Igor Levit sometimes feel the urge to break out of his life, which has been planned in advance for years, to seek freedom? How much freedom is there in music? We filmed from May 2019 to December 2020 and were allowed to accompany Igor Levit, to concerts, rehearsals and recordings. Spoke at the beginning in front of the camera about his career and his plans for the future. And we rattled along with him into the crisis, into the Corona Lockdown. It gave him many dark hours, but it also opened up new possibilities for him. The music saved him, he says. And so our film became another one. It became a film about music and working on music, also about the body and listening, about the connection that is formed between music makers and listeners. Some of the questions I asked myself at the beginning are perhaps best answered here, beyond language.
